

Stand Against Big Pharma. Protect NYS Hospitals and Communities. Pass the 340B Anti-Discrimination Act.

5 reasons why you should support S.8992-A (Rivera)/A.7789 (Paulin) of 2024:

- 1 It protects your hospital:** The 340B Drug Pricing Program provides drug discounts to safety net hospitals, clinics and other health centers. These discounts allow them to reach at-risk populations, improve services and subsidize chronic government underpayment. Unfortunately, major pharmaceutical companies are undermining the 340B program by imposing discriminatory practices that restrict providers' access to discounted medications.
- 2 It stops pharmaceutical greed:** The bill prevents pharmaceutical companies from imposing unfair restrictions on safety net providers to maximize their profits at the expense of vulnerable communities.
- 3 It costs taxpayers nothing:** The 340B program helps safety net hospitals stretch scarce resources without costing taxpayers a dime. 340B discounts come directly from billion-dollar drug companies and represent a small fraction (3.1%) of drug industry revenue.
- 4 It ensures fair access:** Your local 340B hospital should have the same access to medications as other hospitals, but Big Pharma doesn't want them to. Pharmaceutical companies are undermining the 340B program by:
 - restricting hospital use of community and specialty contract pharmacies;
 - imposing administrative barriers and labor-intensive requirements to discourage providers from participating in the 340B program; and
 - requiring providers to disclose proprietary data as a condition of payment.
- 5 It joins New York with other states:** To date, nine states have enacted laws prohibiting drug companies' contract pharmacy restrictions and legislation is pending in three others. New York should join the growing momentum of states passing 340B anti-discrimination laws. Washington cannot be relied on to protect this important program.

NYS policymakers can prevent big pharmaceutical companies from weakening our providers and threatening New Yorkers' access to care.

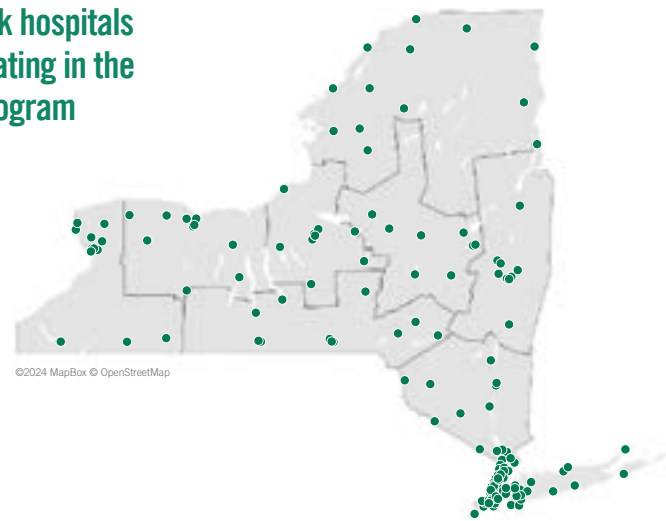
